### Pastor's Ponderings...

#### "Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors"

Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the good news of the kingdom, and healing every disease and sickness among the people. News about him spread all over Syria, and people brought to him all who were ill with various diseases, those suffering severe pain, the demon-possessed, those having seizures, and the paralyzed, and he healed them. Large crowds from Galilee, the Decapolis, Jerusalem, Judea and the region across the Jordan followed him. —*Matthew 4:23-25.*

Jesus' ministry, from the very beginning, was all about going into the world to **meet needs**: to heal, help, and give hope.

**The traditional model for church growth** has been to invite people to worship, get them involved in fellowship and Christian Education, then send them out for service. **The emerging model for churches is just the opposite.** Growing churches like ours are inviting people into **mission and ministry first.** Because of their ministry experience, they may want to become a part of the worship, fellowship, and study, and be encouraged to go deeper in risk-taking, sacrificial mission and ministry. But **the primary goal is not to make them church goers.** The goal is that we all become **world changers** by being in the world, offering the grace and nurture of God to people across the community and world.

**Our impact as a church no longer is gauged so much by the number of people in worship as by the number of people who are touched by God's love through our loving outreach.**

Many people, especially those between 18 and 35 years old, are not so sure about church or Jesus or God, but they do know **they want to do something to make a difference** in the world. They are acutely aware of the problems in the world because of the huge flow of constant information through television and the internet, and they want to do something to help. They want their life to matter. They want to leave something of value in the world.

A new **website** sponsored by the United Methodist Church—[10thousanddoors.org](http://10thousanddoors.org)—is opening doors for people to be involved in ministry through their local United Methodist Church. Our denomination's motto, "**Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors,**" is taking on a **new emphasis.** Instead of "**Open**" being an adjective, it is now a **verb**:

**"The People of the United Methodist Church:  
Together, We Can... Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors."**

Don't forget the **PASTOR'S CHALLENGE**: Certainly, continue to invite people who have never attended to come to worship. But even more importantly, invite newcomers into **mission, ministry, and service** through our church.
