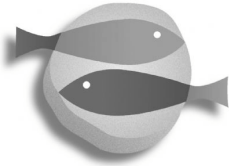

*So...from the fragments of the five barley loaves
left by those who had eaten, they filled twelve baskets.*

John 6: 12-13 NRSV

People of faith,

I am writing this letter about your faith and your life. God works miracles through the willingness of people of faith to share what they have, even when it isn't much. You know the story: 5,000 people, 5 loaves and 2 fish. 12 baskets of leftovers.

Recently I attended the Council of United Methodist Bishops meeting in North Carolina. My husband, Clint was with me. And our 25 year old son, Walker, joined us. During closing worship and communion, Bishop Gregory Palmer reminded us that United Methodists give on average 2% of their income to the church.

2%

This number shocked Walker. He had not heard it before. He knows the biblical standard of a tithe: that a tenth of all you receive belongs to God. He got to thinking about the 98% that most United Methodists keep for their own use. His mind went to the last 1% of that 98% and how we spend it. How it leaks away with little value. He thinks we should all think about this. I agree with him. For a moment, don't think about the 10% of the income you probably spend on health care. Or the 30% most people spend on housing. 14% for food or 18% on transportation. Or recreation 5%. For a minute, disregard the roughly 10% you spend on pension and insurance. The 2.8% on clothing or the 1.6% on education. After that's all accounted for, you still have 9% of your income left over. What value do you get out of that 9%?

We could increase the resources of the church by 50% if every one of us gave just 1% more of our annual income to the church. So here's the thought experiment Walker proposes. What value do you get out of your last 1% of expenses? For me it's the energy wasted when I leave the power bar on at night. Or the extra cost of printing color copies when black and white would be fine. It's bottled water instead of tap. It's the fast food and the latte. And the food that I can't eat before it goes bad. The third white sweater on my shelf. It's finance charges on a late payment. Not much value to any of it.

What value would it have if you gave it to the church?

- Music and candles and flowers
- Chaplains in hospitals and prisons, with the military and on college campuses
- Baptism, communion and weddings
- Prayers for healing, for forgiveness, for employment

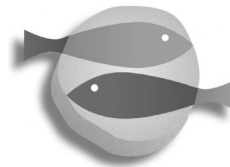
- Potlucks and fellowship and Sunday School classes, youth groups
- Lunch and communion in a city park
- Mission teams building churches and digging wells and planting crops
- Flood buckets and birthing kits and school bags
- Summer camps where children and youth learn that they are precious and loved
- Elders nurtured in a community of care at the end of their life

When the disciples asked Jesus how they should feed 5,000 hungry people on a hillside, they felt the scarcity of the moment. Lots of need, few resources. But when Jesus invited the people to share what they had, all were satisfied with lots left over. We all feel the uncertainty and scarcity of this moment of history. And yet I know God is working miracles of abundance through God's people. Individuals who have lost their jobs or their investments or their homes are struggling. But in this time of scarcity, giving in most of our churches has been generous. We have turned to one another and experienced the abundance that comes from sharing.

But the bible tells us that there was enough to feed the people, AND MORE! Won't you dedicate that last 1% of your income for the purposes of God in the world? Won't you entrust it to the church? As we approach the holy days of Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Years, together we can do something joyful and amazing. Please share what you have with your church. Not all you have. A little more than you were planning to share. If we gather it up, God will turn it into a blessing.

You are the light of the world!

Dear friends,

A little boy and girl were singing their favorite carol in church the Sunday before Christmas. The boy concluded "Silent Night" with the words, "Sleep in heavenly beans."

"No," his sister corrected, "not beans. Peas."

The story reminds me of the all of the wonderful activities of Advent and Christmas in most of our churches: singing carols, lighting an Advent wreath, Christmas sermons, possibly a children's program and Christmas Eve candle lighting services. I hope you find it a festive and inspirational time of year.

Dave Garroway was, for many years, the host of the TODAY show on NBC. Someone once asked him about his understanding of Christmas. He replied: "I've noticed that when people are asked what they want for Christmas, nine times out of ten, they answer with something material. That used to be amusing to me, but it's not amusing to me any longer. I happen to be one of those people who can afford anything he wants, but I find what I really want, I can't buy at all. I want peace of mind, peace of soul; the kind of peace you have when you don't really want anything."

What do YOU want for Christmas? For me, what I want cannot be bought or gift-wrapped. What I want most can best be summed up in words like "faith," "hope" and "love."

For myself, I want faith. Faith enough to see God's hand working in even the bleakest of situations. Faith enough to believe that the goodness of God will prevail in the end. Faith enough to trust without reservation.

For my church I want hope. Abundant hope. Hope in tomorrow. A hope that believes that better times lay ahead and a hope that empowers us to step out with God.

For my world I want love. And I believe that the solutions to most of our biggest problems will only be found when we decide that we are indeed one family. The problems of war, health insurance, crime in American streets and illegal immigration take on a different hue when I am talking about my brothers and sisters whom I love dearly.

Do you also want things for Christmas you can't buy? I pray that we will all find those things this year that truly matter.

By the way, Beth Richardson's new book, *The Uncluttered Heart: Making Room for God During Advent and Christmas*, has been recommended as a worthwhile one to read this Advent season. *The Uncluttered Heart* offers four weeks of guided reflection through the weeks of Advent on through Epiphany. 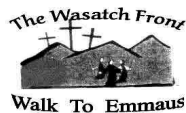
